This coin celebrates Ahatanhel Krymsky. A Ukrainian historian, specialist in Slavic studies, linguist, Orientalist scholar, writer, and translator, Krymsky was one of the founders of the Ukrainian Academy of Sciences and one of the first academy fellows.

Krymsky, who was fluent in almost sixty languages, mostly Oriental ones, and knew all of the dialects of the Ukrainian language, made a significant contribution to Ukrainian Oriental studies and Ukrainian studies.

The unique contribution of Krymsky to global culture was recognized by a decision of the UNESCO General Assembly to include this outstanding personality in UNESCO's eminent personalities list.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, to the right of which is the legend УКРАЇНА/ 2 ГРИВНІ/2021 (Ukraine/2 hryvnias/2021);

there is a composition that symbolizes the activity of the Oriental scholar and his source of knowledge, consisting of a geometrical ornament made up of open books that form a many-sided star; in the center of the star are the following words of Krymsky: Я ЗРОЗУМІВ/ЩО МУШУ БУТИ/ УКРАЇНОФІЛОМ –/ЦЕ Я ЗРОЗУМІВ/ЦІЛКОМ СВІДОМО (I have realized that I must be a Ukrainophile – this was a perfectly conscious decision); under the quote is the facsimile A Кримський; beneath, to the right is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: against the backdrop of vertical lines, which produce a certain dramatic effect and symbolize the tragic fate of the scientist, is a portrait of Krymsky; below the portrait is the diagonal legend ΑΓΑΤΑΗΓΕΛ (Ahatanhel) (to the left) and ΚΡИΜСЬΚИЙ (Krymsky) (to the right); beneath are the years of Krymsky's birth and death – 1871–1942.

This coin celebrates Lesia Ukrainka (Larysa Petrivna Kosach), who was a Ukrainian poetess, playwright, translator, literary critic, and public figure.

Lesia Ukrainka was one of the most prominent Ukrainian wordsmiths. Her multifaceted talent was manifested in a variety of genres, such as lyric poetry, epic, drama, prose, and journalism. Her works are full of deep patriotic feelings for Ukraine.

Obverse: above is the legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine), to the right of which is Ukraine's small coat of arms; there is a composition that symbolizes the bright, emotional and rich world of Lesia Ukrainka's poetry:

to the left, against a smooth background, are stylized images of a man and woman that are made to look like candles; to the right is a herd of cranes, above which are the coin's face value and issue year 20/ГРИВЕНЬ/2021 (20/hryvnias/2021).

Reverse: against the backdrop of stylized tree branches with leaves is a portrait of Lesia Ukrainka; to the left are the years of Ukrainka's birth and death 1871/1913; under the portrait are the following legends: ЛЕСЯ/ УКРАЇНКА (Lesia/Ukrainka), Л. КОСАЧ-КВІТКА/ (В ЛІТЕРАТУРІ ЛЕСЯ УКРАЇНКА) (L. Kosach-Kvitka/ (pen name Lesia Ukrainka) (Ukrainka's facsimile).

This coin celebrates the Lviv University Astronomical Observatory, a research and development center. One of the oldest observatories in Eastern Europe, it was founded in 1771.

At that time, the study of celestial bodies in Lviv was at the same level as that in Berlin, Vilnius or Vienna, as the observatory's equipment was not inferior to that in similar contemporary European institutions. Scientists were trained in Lviv University, which launched an astronomy course to that end.

The main activities of the modern institution are the study of the Sun, stars, the interstellar medium, galaxies and the Universe as a whole. Laser-range, photometric and positional observations of the artificial satellites of the Earth are also an important area of the observatory's activity. A set of telescopes for such observations is in the register of scientific objects that are part of the national heritage of Ukraine.

Obverse: against the backdrop of a stylized image of a starry sky is Ukraine's small coat of arms (above), below which is the legend УΚΡΑΪΗΑ/2021 (Ukraine/2021); in the center, against a smooth background, is a telescope that belongs to Lviv University; beneath is the semicircular legend Π'ЯΤЬ ΓΡИΒΕΗЬ (five hryvnias); to the right of the telescope is the mint mark of the NBU's Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: there is a composition that symbolizes the first documented astronomical observations in Lviv – against the smooth backdrop of the silhouette of a cityscape of the 18th century Lviv is an image of an astronomer of that time; beneath is a city wall, against the backdrop of the wall are the legend 250/POKIB (250/years) and the building of the observatory; above is the following semicircular legend: ACTPOHOMIYHA OBCEPBATOPIR ЛЬВІВСЬКОГО УНІВЕРСИТЕТУ (Lviv University Astronomical Observatory).

This coin celebrates the Mykolaiv astronomical observatory, a research and development center. One of the oldest observatories in Eastern Europe, it was founded in 1821 as a marine observatory, with a view of providing the Black Sea Fleet with maps, and teaching naval officers methods of astronomical orientation.

The observatory was involved in doing an important astronomical task – creating a celestial fundamental coordinate system. This was done through the joint efforts of observatories across the world to produce fundamental catalogues on the basis of millions of separate observations and the measurement of the positions of stars for almost 200 years.

Today, the observatory mainly studies near-Earth objects and the movements of Solar System bodies, creates astrometric catalogues of stars, provides information support for astronomical research, and makes astronomical instruments.

Obverse: against the backdrop of a stylized fragment of the globe is Ukraine's small coat of arms (above);

above the coat of arms is the legend 2021, with the legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine) being below it; in the center is the original building of the observatory, which is built to a special design and boasts a unique round room and stonework; beneath is the semicircular legend Π 'ATB Γ PUBEHb (five hryvnias); to the right, is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: there are the following astronomical instruments: against a smooth background is a meridian circle, to the left of which is the legend 1821, the legend 2021 is to the right of the circle; above the circle, against a matt background, is a symbolic center of the observatory with its coordinates, which were determined by Karl Knorre, the first director of the observatory (to the left); to the right of the center is the outline of a sextant; there is the following circular legend: 200 POKIB МИКОЛАЇВСЬКІЙ АСТРОНОМІЧНІЙ ОБСЕРВАТОРІЇ (200 Years since the Establishment of the Mykolaiv Astronomical Observatory).

These coins celebrate the Reshetylivka carpet-making style – Ukrainian heritage from Poltava oblast. The Reshetylivka carpet-making style is characterized by special stylized floral motifs that look like broken branches with flowers and leaves. Weaving, carpet-making and embroidery experts from Reshetylivka rose to national fame in the late 19th century.

Reshetylivka floral motif-based carpet-making traditions – a treasure trove of Ukrainian folk art – were added to the National List of Ukraine's Intangible Cultural Heritage in 2017.

Obverse: in the center, against the smooth background of an outline of a landscape scene, is Ukraine's small coat of arms (to the left); in the middle is a tree of life – a traditional symbol found in the ornaments on Ukrainian weaved carpets, towels, pysankas

(painted eggs), and so on; to the right is the coins' face value: 10 on the silver coin and 5 on the nickel silver one; against the backdrop of stylized carpets are the following legends: $YKPA\ddot{I}HA$ (Ukraine) (to the left) and $\Gamma PUBEHb$ (hryvnias) (to the right); beneath is the coin issue year -2021.

On the nickel silver coin, the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works is located in the center, to the right of the tree of life.

Reverse: there is the following composition: to the left is a smooth outline of a weaver at work; to the right are a colored fragment of a carpet and the following semicircular legend on a smooth background: PELIETUATIBC bke kuammapers (Reshetylivka carpet-making style).

This coin celebrates the 150th birth anniversary of Vasyl Stefanyk, a talented Ukrainian modernist, an unsurpassed master of expressionist short stories, a poet, a public figure and a politician. Although all of Stefanyk's works can be contained in one volume, his name is on a par with the most famous novelists in the world, as his works impress with their exceptional truthfulness, true originality and artistic perfection. "The Blue Book", a collection of short stories, was an important work in the history of Ukrainian prose. This book, which earned Stefanyk general recognition, received enthusiastic reviews from Ivan Franko, Lesia Ukrainka, Mykhailo Kotsiubynskyi and Olha Kobylianska. The writer's other book, "The Stone Cross", was regarded as an important literary achievement.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, on both sides of which are the figures 2021;

Reverse: against a smooth background is a lonely figure of a person who is setting off on a long journey; in the foreground is a stone cross, to the right and left of which are ears of wheat; stylized birds are on both sides of the figure.

These coins celebrate one of the world's largest stone and earth fortresses that survives to this day – unique defensive fortifications that were built over many centuries. Kyiv Fortress National Historical and Archeological Museum is a unique historic site, featuring many constructions related to liberation movements in Ukraine.

Obverse: above, against the backdrop of a stylized composition depicting a fragment of the fortress's arched entryway is Ukraine's small coat of arms, below which is the legend УΚΡΑΪΗΑ (Ukraine); beneath, against a smooth background, is a key, under which are the following legends: 10/ΓΡИΒΕΗЬ/2021

(10/hryvnias/2021) on the silver coin and 5/ГРИВЕНЬ/2021 (5/hryvnias/2021) on the nickel silver one.

The nickel silver coin features the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works, which is located to the right of the key.

Reverse: there is the following composition: a bird's eye view of Kyiv Fortress, to the right of which is a map of the fortifications; beneath are the following legends: KNÏBCbKA (Kyiv) (against a smooth background) and ΦΟΡΤΕЦЯ/XVIII–XIX ст. (fortress/the 18th to the 19th centuries) (against the backdrop of the outline of fortress merlons).

This coin reproduces the design of the Volodymyr the Great 1 hryvnia circulating coin, which was created in 2004. This coin celebrates Kyiv Prince Volodymyr the Great, who was a prominent statesperson, politician, and creator of a powerful Medieval European state – Rus-Ukraine.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, under which is the following legend: УКРАЇНА/ НАЦІОНАЛЬНИЙ БАНК (Ukraine/National Bank); in the center is the coin's face value 1; to the left of the face value are the coin's metal, fine weight and metal fineness Au 999.9/15.55; to the right

of the face value are the legend ΓΟΛΟΒΑ (governor) and the signature of Volodymyr Stelmakh, who held the position of NBU governor in 2010; the semicircular legend ΓΡИΒΗЯ (hryvnia) is below the face value; beneath, against the backdrop of a stylized ornament in the shape of a horse shoe, is the coin issue year 2010; to the left is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: there is an image of Price Volodymyr the Great with a cross in his right hand and a model of the Tithe Church in his left; above is the semicircular legend ВОЛОДИМИР ВЕЛИКИЙ (Volodymyr the Great).

This coin celebrates the national educational institution that trains staff for Ukraine's Internal Ministry, National Police, and central executive bodies.

Ukraine, which is going through difficult times, needs highly qualified specialists who will effectively perform new tasks in combating crime, ensuring public safety, upholding the law, and acting for the benefit of the Ukrainian people.

Obverse: above, to the right, is Ukraine's small coat of arms; in the center, against the backdrop

of a stylized map of Ukraine, is the logo of the National Academy of Internal Affairs; there are the following legends: УКРАЇНА/2021 (Ukraine/2021) (above), 2/ГРИВНІ (2/hryvnias) (vertical, to the left of the logo), and СЛУЖИТИ ТА ЗАХИЩАТИ (serve and protect) (semicircular, beneath); to the right is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: there are an image of the academy building and the following legends: НАЦІОНАЛЬНА АКАДЕМІЯ ВНУТРІШНІХ СПРАВ (National Academy of Internal Affairs) (circular) and 100 POKIB (100 years) (beneath).

This coin celebrates Yevhen Konovalets, a military leader and statesperson who symbolizes the continuity of Ukrainian liberation movements.

Konovalets was a colonel of the Ukrainian People's Republic Army, the first commander of the Ukrainian Military Organization, the head of the Ukrainian Nationalist Leading Body, and the head of the Organization of Ukrainian Nationalists — a political movement that aimed to create an independent Ukrainian state in all ethnic Ukrainian lands. He transformed the Sich military formation into the regiment of the Sich Riflemen, which was the most organized and disciplined unit of the Ukrainian People's Republic Army.

Obverse: to the left is a guelder rose branch, against the backdrop of which is Ukraine's small coat of arms (above), to the right of the coat of arms is the legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine); in the center, against a smooth background is a phaleristics sign in the form of a monogram consisting of two letters "C" entwined

with a red guelder rose branch – the Riflemen Council military decoration awarded by an advisory body under the Sich Riflemen commander Yevhen Konovalets in 1918 – 1919; to the right of the decoration is the following quote by Konovalets: ...БУДЕМО/МАТИ СИЛУ,/ТОДІ ВИЙДЕМО/ ПОБІДНО/З НАЙГІРШОГО/ ЛИХОЛІТТЯ/І ЗДОБУДЕМО/ ВСЕ, ЩО НАМ/ТРЕБА. (If we are strong, then we'll be able to emerge victorious from the greatest misfortune and win everything that we need.), and his facsimile; beneath are the coin's face value 2 ГРИВНІ (2 hryvnias) and issue year 2021; to the left of the military decoration is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: against a smooth background is a stylized portrait of Yevhen Konovalets, to the left of which are the legend OyH (OUN) and a stylized trident with a sword; to the right is the semicircular legend ЄΒΓΕΗ ΚΟΗΟΒΑΛΕЦЬ (Yevhen Konovalets); beneath are the years of Konovalets' birth and death 1891 – 1938.

This coin celebrates folk art depicting the culture, science and daily routines that Ukrainians have inherited from previous generations. This inheritance is represented by the ancient signs and symbols of the Sun, life forces, the evolution of the Universe, and life in general. These signs and symbols are assets of the unique and universal material and spiritual culture of Ukrainians, which are represented as a code on painted eggs, vyshyvankas, ornaments and so on.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms (gold-plated), above which is the coin's issue year – 2021; beneath are the following semicircular legends: YKPAÏHA (Ukraine) and 10 ГРИВЕНЬ (10 hryvnias); in the center is a spiral decorated with signs, symbols,

protective amulets and ornaments – a symbol with multiple meanings depicting the evolution of the Universe, development, continuity, the rhythm of breathing, and life itself.

Reverse: surrounded by stylized vegetation symbolizing Ukraine's picturesque landscapes is a gold-plated figure of Cossack Mamay, who embodies the Ukrainian mindset and represents the love for freedom, and the immortality of the Ukrainian people. The Cossack holds a stylized Ukrainian sky, Ukrainian culture, and the inheritance built up by the people over many centuries. Above is the legend СПАДОК (inheritance).

*Edge: smooth with incised inscriptions indicating the metal and its fineness Ag 925, fine weight 31.1, and the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Decorative element: local gilding, fine gold no less than 0.002 g

This coin celebrates Vasyl Slipak, a hero of Ukraine, a recipient of the Order of the Gold Star and the Order for Valor, first degree, a knight of liberty, a volunteer, an ex-combatant in eastern Ukraine, and a volunteer soldier who was codenamed "Myth".

Slipak was a world-famous Ukrainian opera singer, a soloist of the Paris National Opera, one of the leaders of the Ukrainian community in France, and a member of the Association of Ukrainians in France. In 2015, he stopped performing on the world's opera stages and started fighting Russian aggressors in Ukraine. On 29 June 2016, at the age of 41, Slipak was killed by a sniper bullet near the village of Luhanske.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, to the right of which is the semicircular legend УКРАЇНА (Ukraine); in the center, against a smooth background, is a portrait of Slipak, to the right of which are a music stave with notes, the coin's face value – 2, the graphic symbol of the hryvnia, the coin's issue year – 2021 and the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works; to the left is the following legend: ВАСИЛЬ СЛІПАК "МІФ" (Vasyl Slipak, "Myth") (semicircular, below).

Reverse: against a smooth background is an image of a nightingale sitting on the barrel of an automatic gun; above and below are stylized tree branches.

This commemorative coin celebrates the 25th anniversary of the Ukrainian constitution – a set of norms and principles that govern public relations and determine the organization of the state. It is the main source of national law, and the core of the entire legal system.

The constitution strengthens the state, while also promoting its political unity and contributing to the social and economic development of society as a whole.

Obverse: against the matt background of a solved puzzle, the outlines of which consist of microtext

containing quotes of some articles from the Ukrainian constitution, is Ukraine's small coat of arms (gold-plated, in the center); above is the legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine); to the right of the coat of arms is the coin's face value 10/ГРИВЕНЬ (10/hryvnias); beneath is the coin's issue year – 2021.

Reverse: against the matt background of a solved puzzle are smooth silhouette images that embody the Ukrainian people and symbolize that each Ukrainian is part of a whole, and that the constitution safeguards the rights of Ukrainians; to the right are Ukraine's small coat of arms and the legend KOHCT/ITYLIIR/YKPAÏH/IN/Ukrainian constitution).

Decorative element: local gilding, fine gold no less than 0.0004 \ensuremath{g}

The coin celebrates navigation facilities, lighthouses.

Ukraine is located on the intersection of trade routes of Eastern Europe and the Mediterranean basin with over 2,500 km of shoreline and has dozens of lighthouses, each with its own name, history, and shape. The lighthouses not only serve the shipping traffic, but are a part of Ukraine's cultural heritage.

The coin celebrates the symbol of rebirth of wild nature, the iconic animal of the reserve, Przewalski's horse being the only remaining extant, nondomesticated wild horse on the international endangered species list, where it is designated as a species on the brink of extinction.

The coin leads off the Chornobyl. Rebirth series. However paradoxical it may seem, a man-made disaster provided nature with the unique opportunity for revival that nature utilized to the fullest.

In 2016, in the area affected by the Chernobyl nuclear power plant disaster, the largest and most recent natural reserve in Ukraine, the Chornobyl Radiation and Ecological Biosphere Reserve, was created. This territory has become a kind of breeding reserve not only for typical animals, but also for endangered species.

This coin is dedicated to an important event in European history in the first half of the 17th century, which effectively decided the fate of Christian civilization – the 400th anniversary of the Battle of Khotyn, during which the Zaporozhian-Polish-Lithuanian army stopped the Ottoman army on the Moldovan border.

In September 1621, the army of Sultan Osman II, many thousands strong, gathered on the battlefield against a much smaller force. The Ottomans attacked the Cossack positions seventeen times, and the positions of the Polish-Lithuanian forces about ten times. The role of the Zaporozhian army, led by the brilliant politician and commander Petro Konashevych-Sahaidachnyi, who employed night-fighting tactics on the enemy, was particularly significant.

Due to huge losses (the army of Ottoman II lost about 40,000 soldiers), the Ottoman Empire was forced to abandon plans to conquer Europe and instead sign the Khotyn Peace Treaty.

This set, which consists of four silver commemorative coins, celebrates Cossack regalia – attributes of power. These regalia are associated with a heroic age of Ukrainian history – an age that has become an inexhaustible source of national dignity, love for freedom and state-building aspirations.

Over the centuries, historical tradition has shaped the list of the Zaporozhian Army's regalia. These include a flag, a mace, a bunchuk (a pole with circularly placed horse tail hairs arranged at the top), a seal, a pernach (a type of flanged mace), kettledrums, surma-horns, and an ink-pot. Hetman seals – integral attributes of the power of hetmans Hryhorii Loboda, Bohdan Khmelnytskyi, Petro Doroshenko and Ivan Skoropadskyi – provided the foundation of the coin set, showing the Cossack age from its birth to its dusk, while also symbolizing powerful historical periods.

This set aims to draw people's attention to the heroic Cossack age, which, for Ukrainians, still remains a source of spiritual feeling and valor inspiring them to defend their land from external enemies.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, below which is the legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine); the three coins on the left

have the face value 10/ ГРИВЕНЬ (10/hryvnias) indicated on the left, while the fourth one on the right has the face value indicated on the right; beneath are the coin issue year, the fine weight of each coin and the metal and its fineness – 2021/31.1/Ag 999, as well as the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works; in the center of each coin are the following compositions: Cossack Mamai – a Ukrainian folkloric hero, who preserves the historical memory of the Ukrainian people and affirms the ideal of a peaceful guardian of his land (on the top coin). On the other three coins are Cossack regalia and other artifacts that symbolize the periods of the Cossack age, enrich the historical background and conjure up the overall atmosphere of the age.

Reverse: there are hetman seals (decorative element – local gilding) – one of the important Cossack regalia of the hetmans Hryhorii Loboda, Bohdan Khmelnytskyi, Petro Doroshenko and Ivan Skoropadskyi. The seals date from the 16th to the 18th centuries and are associated with various stages of Cossack history; there are the following legends: KO3ALIbKI (Cossack) (above) and KЛЕЙНОДИ (regalia) (below); the names of the seal owners are around each seal.

This set celebrates 25 years since currency reform in Ukraine.

A country's currency is one of the most important attributes of its statehood. That is why 2 September 1996 – the day when the domestic currency of Ukraine, the hryvnia, was issued into circulation – has gone down in Ukrainian history as a momentous date. The hryvnia is a successor of the state traditions of Kyiv Rus and the Ukrainian People's Republic.

Today, the NBU's banknote and coin production is modern and highly technological, and the central bank stands ready to supply the Ukrainian economy with high quality banknotes and coins of the required denominations. The set comprises low-denomination 10 and 50 kopiika coins; 1, 2, 5 and 10 hryvnia circulation coins; and a commemorative medal that celebrates 25 years since currency reform in Ukraine.

Hryhorii Skovoroda (1722–1794). An outstanding Ukrainian philosopher, poet, writer, enlightener, pedagogue and musician. He epitomized the spiritual awakening of the Ukrainian society in the end of the XVIIIth century.

The back of the note features the image of the Kyiv Mohyla Academy.

Kyiv Mohyla Academy – the first higher education school in Ukraine founded in 1632; the largest centre of general education in the XVII-XVIIIth centuries. It trained teachers for Slavo-Greek-Latin academies, clerical educators and theological seminary teachers. H. Skovoroda was among the most famous alumni of the Kyiv Mohyla Academy.

To support cash circulation, the National Bank of Ukraine on 23 March 2021 issued a 500-hryvnia banknote designed in 2015, which bears the signature of NBU Governor Kyrylo Shevchenko and the banknote's issue year – 2021.

Taras Shevchenko (1814–1861) was an outstanding Ukrainian poet, artist and thinker, the founder of the new Ukrainian literature. His collection of poetry «Kobzar» has been translated into many languages.

The back of the note features the image of the Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv.

On 15 July 1834, the university inauguration took place. Taras Shevchenko worked as a teacher of drawing of the University school of painters, at the same time holding a post in the Archaeographic Commission of the University (an ad hoc commission for study and publishing of historical documents). In March of 1939, on the occasion of the 125th anniversary of the birth of Taras Shevchenko, the University was named after him.

To support cash circulation, the National Bank of Ukraine on 7 September 2021 issued a 100-hryvnia banknote designed in 2014, which bears the signature of NBU Governor Kyrylo Shevchenko and the banknote's issue year – 2021.

Being a unique phenomenon, his works represent an entire spiritual epoch in Ukrainian history and a significant contribution to world literature.

The back of the note features the image of the Lvyv Opera House.

Lvyv Opera House was built in 1900 by the design of architect Z. Gorgolevsky

Lesia Ukrainka was a prominent Ukrainian writer, translator, and cultural activist, who has been placed on an equal footing with the geniuses Taras Shevchenko and Ivan Franko. For many generations, she became a symbol of rebellious, unique and independent Ukraine.

The back of the note features the Entry Tower of Lutsk Castle.

The Entry Tower of Lutsk Castle was constructed in 1340–1383 on the orders of the last great prince of the Principality of Halych and Volhynia, Demetrius of Liubar. For centuries, Lutsk Castle remained a strong fortress and the administrative, political and spiritual capital of the region. The castle housed the regional government, Seyms, and courts that ruled over cases involving Volyn nobility.

Volodymyr Vernadskyi (1863–1945) was a famous Ukrainian scientist, philosopher, natural scientist, and the founder of the scientific fields of geochemistry, biogeochemistry and radiogeology. He was also one of the founders and the first president of the Ukrainian Academy of Sciences, which was established in 1918.

The back of the note features the Presidium of Ukraine's National Academy of Sciences.

The Presidium of Ukraine's National Academy of Sciences was built in the 1850s to a design by architect Alexander Beretti. In 1892, a third floor was added to the building. Its facade features rustication and an attic decorative element with a cast-iron grid. The building was transferred to the Academy of Sciences in 1918.

The back of the note depicts the Central Council building.

The Central Council building was constructed in 1911 to a design by the famous Kyiv architect Pavlo Alioshyn. In this building, the Central Council, the first national government of Ukraine, adopted its landmark universals.


